Title: *Wielding Citizenshipcraft: The Cases of Liminal Citizenship in Puerto Rico and Immigrant Detention as Evidence of the Illusory Logic Behind Structures of Oppression*

Borrowing from the concept of racecraft (Fields & Fields 2012) I offer the theoretical concept of citizenshipcraft. Using the case of Puerto Rican's liminal citizenship status and the case of immigration detention as starting points, I demonstrate how citizenshipcraft is wielded to uphold structures of capitalism, racism, colonialism and heteropatriarchy.
